There is no doubt Max is the most famous person to have played with the Club. Max left Hobart in 1967 having scored two first grade centuries in his last three games with the Club. Max's sporting record speaks for itself:

85 matches with the Melbourne Football Club 1967-72.

34 Test matches 134 wkts @ 27.47 / 586 runs at 19.53. 1972-77.

Max was the last person to play AFL Football & Test Cricket in the same year.

He was a successful author, raconteur, sports presenter, cricket commentator and architect. Max never forgot where he came from. He always made himself available for NHCC reunions on very generous terms and was the guest speaker in the Club's Centenary Year in 2005.

Max's father Max senior, was a great stalwart of the Club and a first grade premiership player. Max sen was captain of 2nd Grade when his son started at North.

The Club decided to name the MVP for 2nd Grade after Max so that this great and generous man is always remembered.
